# Environmental Policy

## Introduction

Bath Motor Club is committed to the protection of the environment, reducing the detrimental impact of its events on the environment and improving the sustainability of motorsport in the UK. This policy defines Bath Motor Club's approach to achieving this goal. It is reviewed and approved by the Chairman and Committee of the Club.

### <u>Scope</u>

This policy applies to all Bath Motor Club officers involved in the running of the club and organisers of events run by Bath Motor Club Limited.

### **Policy Statements**

Bath Motor Club will:

- Elect an Environmental Officer responsible for monitoring compliance with this policy and providing relevant guidance to the committee and event organisers where possible.
- Establish an Environmental Sustainability System, adopt the <u>Motorsport UK Sustainable Rally Charter</u> as required and work towards appropriate <u>FIA Sustainability Accreditation</u>.
- Demonstrate our genuine commitment to arresting climate change, to help slow or reverse atmospheric CO2 pollution and hence help to mitigate or halt global warming, whilst recognising the contribution of vehicle emissions for which we are directly or indirectly responsible.
- Therefore, take actions to achieve net zero carbon emissions over all events run by Bath Motor Club, through verifiable life-time tree planting, and so ensure the long-term removal, capture or sequestration of carbon dioxide from the atmosphere.
- Systematically assess the environmental impacts of our activities and implement measures to control and mitigate those
  impacts, taking specific actions on each Bath Motor Club event to ensure this policy and related processes are met. This
  will include ensuring environmental legal compliance, controlling noise, protecting from land damage and protecting flora
  and fauna, establishing processes for responsible purchasing, environmental training, learning and improvement and
  communications.
- Continuously improve our environmental performance in areas such as (but not limited to):
  - o the use of single use plastic materials and non-recyclable waste
  - $\circ$   $\$  the amount of paper used and recycleable waste produced
  - $\circ$   $\quad$  the responsible recycling of any waste produced
- The Environmental Officer will provide guidance to event organisers, encourage a consistent approach across events, monitor compliance with this policy and provide feedback to the Bath Motor Club committee
