Bath Motor Club's inaugural Great Western Vintage and Classic Rally ran on Sunday August 18<sup>th</sup> 2024. The rally was aimed particularly at newcomers to historic road rallying and of the 54 entries, 33 were classified as Newcomers. The field also included 16 Experts and 5 Masters. Clerk of the Course Bernard Northmore designed the event so that no special instrumentation was required (GPS trips were allowed for example) and the navigation was by means of various types of jogularity, presented in a comprehensive roadbook – no maps were required and there were no tricks in the navigation. Furthermore, no whites or damaging surfaces were used, thereby reassuring crews that any risk of damage to cars was minimised.

The resultant entry included a wonderful selection of cars ranging in age from a 1931 Riley Biarritz through to a 1984 Mini and in engine size from an Imp through to a TR7V8.

The route started and finished at Walcot Rugby Club grounds on the northern outskirts of Bath and went via two regularities to tests at Cotswold Airport (better known as Kemble) and South Cerney airfield to the lunch halt just outside Cirencester. After lunch a long regularity around the north of Cirencester brought crews back to South Cerney and Kemble to repeat the morning tests and then two more regularities back to Bath for the finish.

The buzz at the finish was remarkable – many of the Newcomers promising to come back for more. Results showed that Newcomers had taken first and second overall.
